Annual Meeting Financials

We want to be transparent about the cost of our programs, so here is a breakdown of the financials from the Annual Meeting:

COSTS: 30,800 Costs include meals and rooms for participants, supplies, and staff travel and work time.

INCOME: 34,500 Income comes from sponsors of the program.

Nearly \$2000 of our costs were spent on food and rooms for people who registered and didn't alert us that they would not be attending. That's enough to help four people with financial assistance requests.

Bayer Announces Discontinuation of Kogenate® FS

From the NHF Website:

Bayer has announced that they are discontinuing the recombinant factor VIII product Kogenate® FS. First approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration in 1993, the therapy has carried multiple indications for children and adults with hemophilia A. The company cited the increasing shift in patient usage towards newer extended half-life products as a primary consideration in the decision. The emergence of novel non-factor hemophilia therapies in recent years may also be contributing to this trend away from standard half-life therapies.

The company anticipates a potential depletion of the larger vial sizes of Kogenate® FS during the fall of 2022, with supplies of the smaller vial sizes likely to be available into 2023. Bayer has set up a hotline (1.833.40.BAYER) to field questions specific to the discontinuation. The line will be available Monday through Friday from 8:30am-8:00pm ET. More information can also be found on a company webpage.

More information about various medications used to treat hemophilia A is available here. If you are affected by this change, speak to your doctors to come up with a new treatment plan.
